Overview of Training:

Part One: This online course, aimed at primary teachers and Geography subject leaders, offers an introduction to the main factors that you will need to think about when organising and implementing outstanding fieldwork across your school. It begins with an introduction to curriculum and Ofsted expectations and expert guidance, before moving on to trying out some practical 'taster' activities for different age and phase groups ... most of which can be carried out in the school grounds and local area. There will also be an opportunity to review quality resourcing and to receive specialist planning support.

Part Two: This online training will focus on how to follow up fieldwork and complete enquiries. The course will study collating data efficiently, ideas for using the data and how the results can be interpreted. Using the findings to further support children's understanding of concepts, processes and core knowledge will also be explored.

Course Content:

- Understand the expectations and rationale for fieldwork in the primary Geography curriculum;
- Be familiar with Ofsted expectations and national expert advice relating to fieldwork;
- Consider how fieldwork can be embedded and sequenced across the school;
- Explore practical fieldwork activities across the primary phases;
- Be aware of support and resourcing for outstanding fieldwork;
- Review fieldwork opportunities within their own school's medium- and long-term planning;
- How to collate and interpret fieldwork data.
